IV. GENERAL INFORMATION:

The Housing Authority of the City of El Paso (HACEP) was created on February 17, 1938, by statute to provide lowincome residents of the City of El Paso with access to low-cost housing. We develop, acquire, lease and operate affordable housing for the residents of El Paso with limited income. The need for housing in El Paso continues to increase throughout the years.

Alamito is the first and oldest HACEP community which was built from 1938-1940. Located at 508 South Virginia in "Segundo Barrio," Alamito is composed of one, two, three and four-bedroom apartments totaling 307 units, all of which were rebuilt through a \$58 million revitalization funded in part by a \$20 million HOPE VI grant. In 2013, HACEP proudly celebrated its 75th anniversary. Although we are funded primarily by the federal government, we operate in many respects as a private management company. We employ industry best practices.

One of the hallmarks of HACEP is that we offer our residents a hand up rather than just a hand out. The staff of the Community Services Department motivates and encourages HACEP residents to improve their social, educational, and economic opportunities on their way to self-sufficiency and economic independence. A number of grant-funded programs offer opportunities for residents to attain a GED or higher education, secure gainful employment, improve their credit scores and even buy a home of their own! This is only possible with a dedicated team of compassionate professionals who individually work with each program participant for months and even years.

In the past decade, HACEP has been recognized numerous times by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as a High Performer in both the Public Housing and the Housing Choice Voucher Programs according to the Public Housing Assessment System (PHAS) and the Section 8 Management Assessment Program (SEMAP) by receiving ratings of at least 90 percent. HACEP has also been recognized by the National Association of Housing and Redevelopment Officials (NAHRO) with dozens of Awards of Merit and one Award of Excellence.

HACEP is governed by a five-member Board of Commissioners appointed by the Mayor of the City of El Paso. The Resident Commissioner lives in public housing and represents the voice of all residents. The Chief Executive Officer reports to the Board of Commissioners. Currently, HACEP has a workforce of 430 full-time employees in 10 major divisions. HACEP operations are headed by the Chief Operating Officer who provides oversight to the Office of Public Housing, the Office of Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers, and the Office of Development and Capital Funds. The administrative division is headed by the Chief Financial Officer who provides oversight to the Office of Procurement and Contract Compliance, the Office of Budget and Grants Compliance, and the Office of Accounting and Finance. The CEO manages all daily operations of HACEP including the administrative offices of the Chief Operating Officer, the Chief Financial Officer, the Chief Information Officer, the Legal Department, the Chief Human Resources Officer, and the Public Information and Government Relations Officer.

It is our desire that the HACEP staff, employees and their families, have access to quality benefits in at an affordable cost. It should also be understood that whereas it is the intent of the HACEP to provide access to these offered benefits, it is not a mandatory requirement for employees to participate with respect to themselves or dependent coverage. An award does not guarantee that all HACEP employees will enroll in any plan.

HUB International Insurance Services is a fee consultant and will receive no other remuneration from any vendor or any insurance company.

Additionally Proposer(s) agree to accept fees/pricing as fully disclosed in the proposal for the plans/services HACEP selects, NET of commissions. X. EVALUATION PROCESS AND SELECTION CRITERIA:

Proposals will be evaluated by HACEP's evaluation panel approved by HACEP's CEO, and in conjunction with our HUB International Insurance Services Consultants. HUB International Insurance Services will be providing HACEP's evaluation panel with technical assistance and support throughout this process. Once all proposals are received in compliance with the submission requirements and due date, HACEP's evaluation panel will review, evaluate, and rank each proposal.

Proposals will be evaluated using the Evaluation Criteria outlined below. After the initial scoring of proposals, those deemed by the selection committee to be within the competitive range will become the finalists and may be invited to make a formal presentation. Discussions, proposal clarifications, and review of best and final proposals will take place with the selected finalists.  (iii) costs and expenses of this contract to which the HA, HUD, or Comptroller General or any of their duly authorized representatives has taken exception shall continue until disposition of such appeals, litigation, claims, or exceptions.

5. Rights in Data (Ownership and Proprietary Interest)

The HA shall have exclusive ownership of, all proprietary interest in, and the right to full and exclusive possession of all information, materials and documents discovered or produced by Contractor pursuant to the terms of this Contract, including but not limited to reports, memoranda or letters concerning the research and reporting tasks of this Contract.

6. Energy Efficiency

The contractor shall comply with all mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (Pub.L. 94-163) for the State in which the work under this contract is performed.

7. Disputes

- (a) All disputes arising under or relating to this contract, <u>except</u> for disputes arising under clauses contained in Section III, <u>Labor Standards Provisions</u>, including any claims for damages for the alleged breach there of which are not disposed of by agreement, shall be resolved under this clause.
- (b) All claims by the Contractor shall be made in writing and submitted to the HA. A claim by the HA against the Contractor shall be subject to a written decision by the HA.
- (c) The HA shall, with reasonable promptness, but in no event in no more than 60 days, render a decision concerning any claim hereunder. Unless the Contractor, within 30 days after receipt of the HA's decision, shall notify the HA in writing that it takes exception to such decision, the decision shall be final and conclusive.
- (d) Provided the Contractor has (i) given the notice within the time stated in paragraph (c) above, and (ii) excepted its claim relating to such decision from the final release, and (iii) brought suit against the HA not later than one year after receipt of final payment, or if final payment has not been made, not later than one year after the Contractor has had a reasonable time to respond to a written request by the HA that it submit a final voucher and release, whichever is earlier, then the HA's decision shall not be final or conclusive, but the dispute shall be determined on the merits by a court of competent jurisdiction.
- (e) The Contractor shall proceed diligently with performance of this contract, pending final resolution of any request for relief, claim, appeal, or action arising under the contract, and comply with any decision of the HA.

8. Contract Termination; Debarment

A breach of these Contract clauses may be grounds for termination of the Contract and for debarment or denial of participation in HUD programs as a Contractor and a subcontractor as provided in 24 CFR Part 24.

9. Assignment of Contract

The Contractor shall not assign or transfer any interest in this contract; except that claims for monies due or to become due from the HA under the contract may be assigned to a bank, trust company, or other financial institution. If the Contractor is a partnership, this contract shall inure to the benefit of the surviving or remaining member(s) of such partnership approved by the HA.

10. Certificate and Release

Prior to final payment under this contract, or prior to settlement upon termination of this contract, and as a condition precedent thereto, the Contractor shall execute and deliver to the HA a certificate and release, in a form acceptable to the HA, of all claims against the HA by the Contractor under and by virtue of this contract, other than such claims, if any, as may be specifically excepted by the Contractor in stated amounts set forth therein.

11. Organizational Conflicts of Interest

- (a) The Contractor warrants that to the best of its knowledge and belief and except as otherwise disclosed, it does not have any organizational conflict of interest which is defined as a situation in which the nature of work under this contract and a contractor's organizational, financial, contractual or other interests are such that:
 - Award of the contract may result in an unfair competitive advantage; or
 - (ii) The Contractor's objectivity in performing the contract work may be impaired.
- (b) The Contractor agrees that if after award it discovers an organizational conflict of interest with respect to this contract or any task/delivery order under the contract, he or she shall make an immediate and full disclosure in writing to the Contracting Officer which shall include a description of the action which the Contractor has taken or intends to take to eliminate or neutralize the conflict. The HA may, however, terminate the contract or task/delivery order for the convenience of the HA if it would be in the best interest of the HA.
- (c) In the event the Contractor was aware of an organizational conflict of interest before the award of this contract and intentionally did not disclose the conflict to the Contracting Officer, the HA may terminate the contract for default.
- (d) The terms of this clause shall be included in all subcontracts and consulting agreements wherein the work to be performed is similar to the service provided by the prime Contractor. The Contractor shall include in such subcontracts and consulting agreements any necessary provisions to eliminate or neutralize conflicts of interest.

12. Inspection and Acceptance

(a) The HA has the right to review, require correction, if necessary, and accept the work products produced by the Contractor. Such review(s) shall be carried out within 30 days so as to not impede the work of the Contractor. Any

- (c) Requirements imposed by or pursuant to law as a condition for receiving a covered Federal award include those required by law or regulation, or reasonably expected to be required by law or regulation, and any other requirements in the actual award documents.
- (d) Only those services expressly authorized by subdivisions (b)(ii)(2)(a)(i) and (ii) of this section are permitted under this clause.
 (iii) Selling activities by independent sales representatives.
- (c) The prohibition on the use of appropriated funds, in subparagraph (b)(i) of this clause, does not apply to the following selling activities before an agency by independent sales representatives, provided such activities are prior to formal solicitation by an agency and are specifically limited to the merits of the matter.

In addition, sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked against the Contractor as provided in Executive Order 11248, as amended, the rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.

18. Contractor's Status

It is understood that the Contractor is an independent contractor and is not to be considered an employee of the HA, or assume any right, privilege or duties of an employee, and shall save harmless the HA and its employees from claims suits, actions and costs of every description resulting from the Contractor's activities on behalf of the HA in connection with this Agreement.

19. Other Contractors

HA may undertake or award other contracts for additional work at or near the site(s) of the work under this contract. The contractor shall fully cooperate with the other contractors and with HA and HUD employees and shall carefully adapt scheduling and performing the work under this contract to accommodate the additional work, heeding any direction that may be provided by the Contracting Officer. The contractor shall not commit or permit any act that will interfere with the performance of work by any other contractor or HA employee.

20. Liens

The Contractor is prohibited from placing a lien on HA's property. This prohibition shall apply to all subcontractors.

- 21. Training and Employment Opportunities for Residents in the Project Area (Section 3, HUD Act of 1968; 24 CFR 135)

Overview and Instructions for Contractors

HACEP's Section 3 policy requires that when the <u>Section 3 regulation is triggered by a need for new hires</u> (whether individual employees, contractors or sub-contractors), every effort within the contractor's disposal must be made to the greatest extent feasible to offer all available employment and contracting opportunities to its residents based on the tiers below. Only when the regulation is triggered by a contractor and they are unable to offer employment or contracting. The contractor may offer employment related training to the Section 3 residents.

I. Tiers for offering all opportunities to Section 3 Residents and Resident Owned Businesses

Step 3 Utilize the Section 3 Clause in RFB's, RFP', RFQ's, etc., contracts and subcontracts.

Step 4 Hold informational meetings when possible prior to requesting bids or taking applications so the residents or businesses are encouraged to apply for the employment or contracting.

Step 5 Provide preference in hiring and contracting to Section 3 applicants and contractors when all factors are equal for the opportunity, including price and salary requests.

Such documentation must include detailed receipts for all requested amounts and the valid business reason for the expense. In addition, where HACEP management approval is required prior to reimbursement, Contractor must submit a memo detailing management's approval or the signature of the appropriate HACEP management representative on the detailed receipt. HACEP reserves the right to request additional information when assessing payment and may refuse or limit payment based on the documentation, or lack thereof, provided.

- Airfare Airfare is reimbursed at commercial Coach Class using lowest logical airfare and advance purchase options. Airfare should be booked as soon as practical to obtain best pricing options. HACEP allows non-stop service to be considered as lowest logical airfare. HACEP will not reimburse unused tickets, airport ticket class changes, or seat location upgrades. Use of non-commercial air service is expressly prohibited.
- **Tolls and Parking** Parking will be reimbursed at actual cost for business trip expense. Commuter tolls and parking within city metropolitan area where work is performed is not reimbursable.
- **Transportation Services** While scheduled transportation service using airport shuttles is permitted with proper receipts, private limousine or luxury shuttle service is **not reimbursable**. Taxi service is allowed in lieu of auto rental, however receipts must be provided.
- **Personal Vehicle** Use of a personal vehicle in lieu of public transportation or a rental car is permitted when pre-approved by HACEP management. Mileage must be tracked on a daily trip log and reimbursement will be calculated at IRS standard mileage rates. Reported mileage must exclude normal commute mileage in accordance with IRS commute definitions. No personal vehicle expense, including gasoline or car repairs, is allowed for reimbursement.
- Entertainment Casual entertainment including alcoholic beverages is not reimbursable. HACEP
 management must pre-authorize any scheduled group events and such events must be limited to
 specific milestone or project recognition events. HACEP will not reimburse Contractor for
 entertaining HACEP employees without prior HACEP management approval.
