- 3. The Housing Authority of the City of El Paso, Texas anticipates award of a contract for Construction Management and Design Project Management Services in response to this solicitation. 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# **SECTION C**

# **SCOPE OF SERVICES**



## BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

HACEP is participating in a program offered by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) called Rental Assistance Demonstration (RAD). RAD seeks to preserve public housing by providing public housing agencies with access to more stable funding to make needed improvements to properties.

Utilizing the RAD program, HACEP is renovating or rebuilding substantially all of its portfolio of about 6,300 public housing units in a program that started in 2015 and will be completed with construction in first half of 2021.

All of the projects included in this RFP, including RAD, non-RAD and optional projects and are located within the city limits of El Paso, TX. The portfolio consists of primarily low-rise garden-style communities and high-rise buildings. Other projects include the construction of commercial office/retail as well as urban park and streetscape spaces. HACEP will refurbish or rebuild of six communities and 900 housing units, four on their existing sites and two at new sites. HACEP partnered with third party developers on four of the six projects and is self-developing two projects.

HACEP has successfully used a third party construction management firm since August 2016. The firm has provided construction management, design project management and support services as HACEP's owner's representative for various projects. The current team consists of 1 Team leader, 1 document controller, 2 design managers and 3.5 constructing managers. HACEP to complete the remaining construction projects using third-party Construction and Design Project Management Services as identified on the scope of work on this RFP.

## PROJECT OVERVIEW:

Tranche 3 Renovation Projects (Active in Construction)

For organizational purposes HACEP grouped its portfolio into distinct project groups or Tranches. At this time HACEP continues in execution with Tranche 3 and multiple new construction projects. Specifically, in Tranche 3 HACEP continues in self-development of one community containing 330 units and HACEP partnered with third party developers for the other 12 active construction communities and totaling 2.013 units. Most projects are described as low rise; garden-style developments however high-rise projects are included. A total of 2,016 RAD active construction units remain to be completed, a total of 291 Non-RAD active construction units remain to be completed, 90 planned RAD units and 656 optional units remain to be completed. A grand total of 3,053 units, 3 CDBG projects and 40,000 SF of office/retail space tenant improvement construction are included in this RFP

HACEP has history of working with a third party Construction Management services provider firm for the execution of the RAD program and continues to do so through RAD conversion completion. The third party firm provides both design and construction project management services to the HACEP team and with responsibilities of design and construction project management execution on behalf of owner, HACEP, serving in the role as owner's representative.

HACEP earlier hired A/E teams for design and engineering work in the Tranche 3 portfolio: Wright and Dalbin Architects, Inc. (El Paso, TX), and Carl Daniels and Associates (El Paso, TX). The local engineering firm of EMC provided engineering services through these architects. Construction general contractors were selected for the Tranche 3 portfolio as well. Sundt Construction (El Paso, TX) was selected as the construction general contractor for the four high-rise communities in this group, initially using a CMAR type contract format. Thereafter Sundt was selected for the General Contracting requirements using a Cost-Plus Fee GMP type of contract. Sundt has also been selected for low-rise garden-style properties as well. Pavilion Construction too was selected and is active with a new construction property and a renovation property.

HACEP selected four (4) third party co-development partners for portions of Tranche 3. The developer partner Tranche 3 projects continue in construction and are included in this RFP.



The CM has direct responsibility for overseeing all construction activities as owner's representative, including handover of the property/units to the contractor at the start of construction, managing the construction contractors as owner's representative, overseeing all construction activity, and managing satisfactory construction closeout, including timely acceptance of the finished community, collecting and archiving project documentation, and property/units handover to HACEP property management.

A detailed breakdown of the hard cost budget and other project information, including the distribution of projects between self- and third party development, is provided in Exhibit D.

## SCOPE OF SERVICES:

This Request for Proposal is for qualified construction management firms ("CM") to provide comprehensive design project management, construction management and support services as HACEP's owner's representative for the Projects.

## Design Project Management Services

Working closely with HACEP staff the CM will manage all A/E work during the design and entitlement stages, and will provide general advice on constructability, scheduling, and other construction issues. CM will provide design project management services to support existing RAD renovation and new construction projects in construction and containing approximately 2257 units in active construction, as well as services to existing non-RAD communities containing 370 housing units, and planned new construction affordable housing communities containing approximately 90 housing units. A total of approximately 3053 housing units are included in this RFP together with the possibility of additional units. HACEP may require CM for some of the Non-RAD Program (Optional Construction) units totaling 656 (included in the aforementioned total unit quantity).

## Construction Project Management Services

The CM provides direct management of all construction activities as owner's representative. During construction, the CM continues to oversee the Construction Administration (CA) services provided by the Architect/Engineer team to ensure timely responses on contractor Requests for Information (RFIs) and submittal approvals.

The CM represents HACEP and is responsible for monitoring monthly construction progress and developer compliance with schedule milestones such as building transfers to and from the construction contractor. The CM participates in apartment completion inspections and created "Owner Punch-lists" at apartment transfer. CM performs quality assurance observations and field reviews of in-progress construction for compliance with contract requirements. CM to provide regular weekly reporting to ownership on all construction matters. CM to alert ownership to any variances from plans, specifications, contract documents, schedules, and relevant matters to the successful timely, quality and on-budget outcome of the project. CM audits developer approved construction pay applications against actual contractor progress and had a limited role in change order review.

Construction Management Services requested include but are not be limited to:

- 1. Coordinating any early access activities for investigations and testing at communities.
- 2. Inspection and handover of communities to the contractor at the start of construction
- 3. Regular field observations and reporting, including preparing and tracking deficiency notifications, monitoring contractor quality control activities, and direct quality assurance testing as required to assure contract compliance
- 4. Coordinating or assisting the contractor in coordination with utility providers
- 5. Running regular construction meetings, including all meeting documentation
- 6. Reviewing contractor's monthly construction schedule updates and preparing reports on contractor progress or deviations from the project construction plan



- 7. Reviewing contractor requests for changes in conjunction with the project architect to verify actual field conditions, proposed scope of work, and cost
- 8. Preparing weekly and monthly construction status reports including regular photo documentation of the construction.
- 9. Project closeout, including final inspections, compiling warranty and other project information, completing project files, compiling as-built documentation, and preparing and administering the punch list
- 10. Acceptance of the community from the construction contractor and handover to HACEP property management.

Work hours to be:

Normal work hours are Monday through Friday from 7am - 4pm, or as required to achieve owner objectives. Work hours may include weekend hours as construction activities may be required to be scheduled.

The completion of Tranche 3 projects, together with additional non-RAD projects and one (1) planned LIHTC projects totaling approximately 3,053 units, are the subject of this RFP.

Placed-In-Service, 2019 (Active)

In 2017 HACEP applied for tax credits for two communities, containing 266 housing units, was awarded the tax credits in July, 2017 and started construction on the projects in mid to late 2018. These projects, one being built on new greenfield site and the other a downtown adaptive reuse, are also being completed through third party development partnerships. In the case of these two developments, the third party developers directly engaged and manage the A/E and construction teams. GNB Architects and Alamo Architects head the A/E teams respectively for these projects. The construction contractors selected by the third party developer and HACEP are Pavilion and Sundt Construction respectively; the construction contracts are GMP type formats. As stated earlier, the continued construction of these units are included in this RFP.

The hard cost construction budget for the projects is approximately \$93,000,000.

Placed-In-Service, 2021 (Planned)

In 2019 HACEP applied for tax credits for two communities, containing approximately 195 housing units, with expectation of award of the tax credits in July, 2019 and start of construction on the 90 unit project in mid-2020. The awarded project is to be completed through third party development partnerships. The third party developers will directly engage and manage the A/E and construction teams. The construction contractors will be selected by the third party developer and HACEP with use of GMP contracts. The construction of these planned 160 housing units are included in this RFP.

#### Additional Support Services

HACEP reserves the right to request additional design and construction services on as needed basis.

#### SCHEDULE

The CM will assume responsibility of the aforesaid on-going RAD and other construction programs that have been in progress for several years and estimated completion dates of the subject contract period on or about December 31, 2021.

The program status at the time of the release of this RFP is as follows:

Tranche 3 – Co-Developed Construction in process on twelve (12) communities containing 1, 989 housing units. A total of 1,458 203 housing units as of 3/31/19 are currently in construction. Percentage completions as of 3/31/19 are:



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- Commissioners' Corner II (68% Complete)
- Sandoval (35% Complete),
- Valle Verde (75%),
- Cramer I (11% Complete),
- Guillen (12% Complete),
- Martin Luther King (8% Complete),
- Kathy White (0% Complete),
- DeWetter (0% Complete),
- Eisenhower (0% Complete%),
- Medano Heights (16% Complete) and
- Blue Flame II (45% Complete)
- Please refer to Exhibit B, Construction Schedule, for best understanding of the respective project schedules.

## Tranche 3 – Self- Developed

• Construction in process on one high-rise community, Chelsea Community, containing 330 units. Phase one and two containing 199 units have been completed. The balance of approximately 131 housing units are currently in construction and with scheduled completion date of 11/1/19.

## Non-RAD – Self Developed

- A/E work is complete.
- Construction in process on one market rate apartment community containing 370 housing units. As of 3/31/19 a total of 79 units have been completed with minor rehabilitation. A balance of 291 units remain to be renovated. (Villa Alegre)

## New Construction – Co-Developed

- Planned LIHTC community containing approximately 90 housing units and subject to award of 2019 tax credits by TDHCA.
- A/E to be selected by co-developer.
- Construction, subject to tax credit award, of approximately 90 units will be completed/placed-in-service in December, 2021.

HACEP will provide dedicated office space, furniture, desktop computers, network and internet access, and desktop telephones for the CM and DPM staff at its headquarters facility in El Paso, TX.

One existing HACEP construction project management employee will remain on staff and will work on the projects. The HACEP employee together with CM manager will report to HACEP Assistant Director of Construction. Their project assignments, deliverables, and daily activities will be managed by the CM with approval by the HACEP Assistant Director of Construction. They will work alongside the CM's staff proposed for this assignment.

## SELECTION CRITERIA

HACEP is accepting proposals from qualified firms with experience managing multiple projects. Firms responding to this RFP must include in their proposal package the following items and any other relevant material that addresses the section criteria outlined below:

- Capacity and availability to begin work immediately upon contract award and to staff the program appropriately through its life cycle

- Evaluation of a minimum of three relevant references, five references strongly preferred
- Demonstrated experience with quality assurance, job site safety monitoring, and effective team communication
- Appropriate staffing based on a demonstrated understanding of the project and competitive fee

Section I - Clauses for All Non-Construction Contracts greater than \$100,000

#### 1. Definitions

The following definitions are applicable to this contract:

- "Authority or Housing Authority (HA)" means the Housing Authority.
- (b) "Contract" means the contract entered into between the Authority and the Contractor. It includes the contract form, the Certifications and Representations, these contract clauses, and the scope of work. It includes all formal changes to any of those documents by addendum, Change Order, or other modification.
- (c) "Contractor" means the person or other entity entering into the contract with the Authority to perform all of the work required under the contract.
- (d) "Day" means calendar days, unless otherwise stated.
- (e) "HUD" means the Secretary of Housing and Urban development, his delegates, successors, and assigns, and the officers and employees of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development acting for and on behalf of the Secretary.

#### 2. Changes

- (a) The HA may at any time, by written order, and without notice to the sureties, if any, make changes within the general scope of this contract in the services to be performed or supplies to be delivered.
- (b) If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the hourly rate, the not-to-exceed amount of the contract, or the time required for performance of any part of the work under this contract, whether or not changed by the order, or otherwise affects the conditions of this contract, the HA shall make an equitable adjustment in the not-to-exceed amount, the hourly rate, the delivery schedule, or other affected terms, and shall modify the contract accordingly.
- (c) The Contractor must assert its right to an equitable adjustment under this clause within 30 days from the date of receipt of the written order. However, if the HA decides that the facts justify it, the HA may receive and act upon a

proposal submitted before final payment of the contract.

- (d) Failure to agree to any adjustment shall be a dispute under clause Disputes, herein. However, nothing in this clause shall excuse the Contractor from proceeding with the contract as changed.
- (e) No services for which an additional cost or fee will be charged by the Contractor shall be furnished without the prior written consent of the HA.

#### 3. Termination for Convenience and Default

- (a) The HA may terminate this contract in whole, or from time to time in part, for the HA's convenience or the failure of the Contractor to fulfill the contract obligations (default). The HA shall terminate by delivering to the Contractor a written Notice of Termination specifying the nature, extent, and effective date of the termination. Upon receipt of the notice, the Contractor shall: (i) immediately discontinue all services affected (unless the notice directs otherwise); and (ii) deliver to the HA all information, reports, papers, and other materials accumulated or generated in performing this contract, whether completed or in process.
- (b) If the termination is for the convenience of the HA, the HA shall be liable only for payment for services rendered before the effective date of the termination.
- (c) If the termination is due to the failure of the Contractor to fulfill its obligations under the contract (default), the HA may (i) require the Contractor to deliver to it, in the manner and to the extent directed by the HA, any work as described in subparagraph (a)(ii) above, and compensation be determined in accordance with the Changes clause, paragraph 2, above; (ii) take over the work and prosecute the same to completion by contract or otherwise, and the Contractor shall be liable for any additional cost incurred by the HA; (iii) withhold any payments to the Contractor, for the purpose of off-set or partial payment, as the case may be, of amounts owed to the HA by the Contractor.
- (d) If, after termination for failure to fulfill contract obligations (default), it is determined that the Contractor had not failed, the termination shall be deemed to have been effected for the convenience of the HA, and the Contractor shall been titled to payment as described in paragraph (b) above.
- (e) Any disputes with regard to this clause are expressly made subject to the terms of clause titled Disputes herein.

#### 4. Examination and Retention of Contractor's Records

(a) The HA, HUD, or Comptroller General of the United States, or any of their duly authorized representatives shall, until 3 years after final payment under this contract, have access to and the right to examine any of the Contractor's directly pertinent books, documents, papers, or other records involving transactions related to this contract for the purpose of making audit, examination, excerpts, and transcriptions.

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- (b) The Contractor agrees to include in first-tier subcontracts under this contract a clause substantially the same as paragraph (a) above. "Subcontract," as used in this clause, excludes purchase orders not exceeding \$10,000.
- (c) The periods of access and examination in paragraphs (a) and (b) above for records relating to:
  (i) appeals under the clause titled Disputes;
  (ii) litigation or settlement of claims arising from the performance of this contract; or,
  (iii) costs and expenses of this contract to which the HA, HUD, or Comptroller General or any of their duly authorized representatives has taken exception shall continue until disposition of such appeals, litigation, claims, or exceptions.

#### 5. Rights in Data (Ownership and Proprietary Interest)

The HA shall have exclusive ownership of, all proprietary interest in, and the right to full and exclusive possession of all information, materials and documents discovered or produced by Contractor pursuant to the terms of this Contract, including but not limited to reports, memoranda or letters concerning the research and reporting tasks of this Contract.

#### 6. Energy Efficiency

The contractor shall comply with all mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the energy conservation plant issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (Pub.L. 94-163) for the State in which the work under this contract is performed.

#### 7. Disputes

- (a) All disputes arising under or relating to this contract, <u>except</u> for disputes arising under clauses contained in Section III, <u>Labor Standards Provisions</u>, including any claims for damages for the alleged breach there of which are not disposed of by agreement, shall be resolved under this clause.
- (b) All claims by the Contractor shall be made in writing and submitted to the HA. A claim by the HA against the Contractor shall be subject to a written decision by the HA.
- (c) The HA shall, with reasonable promptness, but in no event in no more than 60 days, render a decision concerning any claim hereunder. Unless the Contractor, within 30 days after receipt of the HA's decision, shall notify the HA in writing that it takes exception to such decision, the decision shall be final and conclusive.
- (d) Provided the Contractor has (i) given the notice within the time stated in paragraph (c) above, and (ii) excepted its claim relating to such decision from the final release, and (iii) brought suit against the HA not later than one year after receipt of final payment, or if final payment has not been made, not later than one year after the Contractor has had a reasonable time to respond to a written request by the HA that it submit a final voucher and release, whichever is earlier, then the HA's decision shall not be final or conclusive, but the dispute shall be determined on the merits by a court of competent jurisdiction.
- (e) The Contractor shall proceed diligently with performance of this contract, pending final resolution of any request for relief, claim, appeal, or action arising under the contract, and comply with any decision of the HA.

#### 8. Contract Termination; Debarment

A breach of these Contract clauses may be grounds for termination of the Contract and for debarment or denial of participation in HUD programs as a Contractor and a subcontractor as provided in 24 CFR Part 24.

#### 9. Assignment of Contract

The Contractor shall not assign or transfer any interest in this contract; except that claims for monies due or to become due from the HA under the contract may be assigned to a bank, trust company, or other financial institution. If the Contractor is a partnership, this contract shall inure to the benefit of the surviving or remaining member(s) of such partnership approved by the HA.

#### 10. Certificate and Release

Prior to final payment under this contract, or prior to settlement upon termination of this contract, and as a condition precedent thereto, the Contractor shall execute and deliver to the HA a certificate and release, in a form acceptable to the HA, of all claims against the HA by the Contractor under and by virtue of this contract, other than such claims, if any, as may be specifically excepted by the Contractor in stated amounts set forth therein.

#### 11. Organizational Conflicts of Interest

- (a) The Contractor warrants that to the best of its knowledge and belief and except as otherwise disclosed, it does not have any organizational conflict of interest which is defined as a situation in which the nature of work under this contract and a contractor's organizational, financial, contractual or other interests are such that:
  - Award of the contract may result in an unfair competitive advantage; or
  - (ii) The Contractor's objectivity in performing the contract work may be impaired.
- (b) The Contractor agrees that if after award it discovers an organizational conflict of interest with respect to this contract or any task/delivery order under the contract, he or she shall make an immediate and full disclosure in writing to the Contracting Officer which shall include a description of the action which the Contractor has taken or intends to take to eliminate or neutralize the conflict. The HA may, however, terminate the contract or task/delivery order for the convenience of the HA if it would be in the best interest of the HA.
- (c) In the event the Contractor was aware of an organizational conflict of interest before the award of this contract and intentionally did not disclose the conflict to the Contracting Officer, the HA may terminate the contract for default.
- (d) The terms of this clause shall be included in all subcontracts and consulting agreements wherein the work to be performed is similar to the service provided by the prime Contractor. The Contractor shall include in such subcontracts and consulting agreements any necessary provisions to eliminate or neutralize conflicts of interest.

#### 12. Inspection and Acceptance

(a) The HA has the right to review, require correction, if necessary, and accept the work products produced by the Contractor. Such review(s) shall be carried out within 30 days so as to not impede the work of the Contractor. Any

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product of work shall be deemed accepted as submitted if the HA does not issue written comments and/or required corrections within 30 days from the date of receipt of such product from the Contractor.

- (b) The Contractor shall make any required corrections promptly at no additional charge and return a revised copy of the product to the HA within 7 days of notification or a later date if extended by the HA.
- (c) Failure by the Contractor to proceed with reasonable promptness to make necessary corrections shall be a default. If the Contractor's submission of corrected work remains unacceptable, the HA may terminate this contract (or the task order involved) or reduce the contract price or cost to reflect the reduced value of services received.

#### 13. Interest of Members of Congress

No member of or delegate to the Congress of the United States of America or Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this contract or to any benefit to arise there from, but this provision shall not be construed to extend to this contract if made with a corporation for its general benefit.

#### 14. Interest of Members, Officers, or Employees and Former Members, Officers, or Employees

No member, officer, or employee of the HA, no member of the governing body of the locality in which the project is situated, no member of the governing body in which the HA was activated, and no other pubic official of such locality or localities who exercises any functions or responsibilities with respect to the project, shall, during his or her tenure, or for one year thereafter, have any interest, direct or indirect, in this contract or the proceeds thereof.

#### 15. Limitation on Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions

(a) Definitions. As used in this clause:

"Agency", as defined in 5 U.S.C. 552(f), includes Federal executive departments and agencies as well as independent regulatory commissions and Government corporations, as defined in 31 U.S.C. 9101(1).

"Covered Federal Action" means any of the following Federal actions:

- The awarding of any Federal contract; (i)
- The making of any Federal grant; (iii)
- (iii) The making of any Federal loan;
- (iv) The entering into of any cooperative agreement; and, (v) The extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or
- modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.

Covered Federal action does not include receiving from an agency a commitment providing for the United States to insure or guarantee a loan.

"Indian tribe" and "tribal organization" have the meaning provided in section 4 of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 450B). Alaskan Natives are included under the definitions of Indian tribes in that Act.

"Influencing or attempting to influence" means making, with the intent to influence, any communication to or appearance before an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with any covered Federal action.

"Local government" means a unit of government in a State and, if chartered, established, or otherwise recognized by a State for the performance of a governmental duty, including a local public authority, a special district, an intrastate district, a council of governments, a sponsor group representative organization, and any other instrumentality of a local government.

"Officer or employee of an agency" includes the following individuals who are employed by an agency:

- (i) An individual who is appointed to a position in the Government under title 5, U.S.C., including a position under a temporary appointment;
- (ii) A member of the uniformed services as defined in section 202, title 18, U.S.C.;
- (iii) A special Government employee as defined in section 202, title 18, U.S.C.; and,
- (iv) An individual who is a member of a Federal advisory committee, as defined by the Federal Advisory Committee Act, title 5, appendix 2.

"Person" means an individual, corporation, company, association, authority, firm, partnership, society, State, and local government, regardless of whether such entity is operated for profit or not for profit. This term excludes an Indian tribe, tribal organization, or other Indian organization with respect to expenditures specifically permitted by other Federal law.

"Recipient" includes all contractors, subcontractors at any tier, and subgrantees at any tier of the recipient of funds received in connection with a Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement. The term excludes an Indian tribe, tribal organization, or any other Indian organization with respect to expenditures specifically permitted by other Federal law.

"Regularly employed means, with respect to an officer or employee of a person requesting or receiving a Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, an officer or employee who is employed by such person for at least 130 working days within one year immediately preceding the date of the submission that initiates agency consideration of such person for receipt of such contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement. An officer or employee who is employed by such person for less than 130 working days within one year immediately preceding the date of submission that initiates agency consideration of such person shall be considered to be regularly employed as soon as he or she is employed by such person for 130 working days.

"State" means a State of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, a territory or possession of the United States, an agency or instrumentality of a State, and a multi-State, regional, or interstate entity having governmental duties and powers.

(b) Prohibitio n.

- (i) Section 1352 of title 31, U.S.C. provides in part that no appropriated funds may be expended by the recipient of a Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement to pay any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with any of the following covered Federal actions: the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.
- (ii) The prohibition does not apply as follows:



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 Agency and legislative liaison by Own Employees.

(a) The prohibition on the use of appropriated funds, in paragraph (i) of this section, does not apply in the case of a payment of reasonable compensation made to an officer or employee of a person requesting or receiving a Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, if the payment is for agency and legislative activities not directly related to a covered Federal action.

(b) For purposes of paragraph (b)(i)(1)(a) of this clause, providing any information specifically requested by an agency or Congress is permitted at any time.

(c) The following agency and legislative liaison activities are permitted at any time only where they are not related to a specific solicitation for any covered Federal action:

(1) Discussing with an agency (including individual demonstrations) the qualities and characteristics of the person's products or services, conditions or terms of sale, and service capabilities; and,

(2) Technical discussions and other activities regarding the application or adaptation of the person's products or services for an agency's use.

(d) The following agency and legislative liaison activities are permitted where they are prior to formal solicitation of any covered Federal action:

 Providing any information not specifically requested but necessary for an agency to make an informed decision about initiation of a covered Federal action;

(2) Technical discussions regarding the preparation of an unsolicited proposal prior to its official submission; and

(3) Capability presentations by persons seeking awards from an agency pursuant to the provisions of the Small Business Act, as amended by Public Law 95-507 and other subsequent amendments.

(e) Only those activities expressly authorized by subdivision (b)(ii)(1)(a) of this clause are permitted under this clause.

- (2) Professional and technical services.
  - (a) The prohibition on the use of appropriated funds, in subparagraph (b)(i) of this clause, does not apply in the case of-
    - (i) A payment of reasonable compensation made to an officer or employee of a person requesting or receiving a covered Federal action or an extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of a covered Federal action, if payment is for professional or technical services rendered directly in the preparation, submission, or negotiation of any bid, proposal, or application for that Federal action or for meeting requirements imposed by or pursuant to law as a condition for receiving that Federal action.
    - (ii) Any reasonable payment to a person, other than an officer or employee of a

person requesting or receiving a covered Federal action or an extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of a covered Federal action if the payment is for professional or technical services rendered directly in the preparation, submission, or negotiation of any bid, proposal, or application for that Federal action or for meeting requirements imposed by or pursuant to law as a condition for receiving that Federal action. Persons other than officers or employees of a person requesting or receiving a covered Federal action include consultants and trade associations.

- (b) For purposes of subdivision (b)(ii)(2)(a) of clause, "professional and technical services" shall be limited to advice and analysis directly applying any professional or technical discipline.
- (c) Requirements imposed by or pursuant to law as a condition for receiving a covered Federal award include those required by law or regulation, or reasonably expected to be required by law or regulation, and any other requirements in the actual award documents.
- (d) Only those services expressly authorized by subdivisions (b)(ii)(2)(a)(i) and (ii) of this section are permitted under this clause.
- (iii) Selling activities by independent sales representatives.
- (c) The prohibition on the use of appropriated funds, in subparagraph (b)(i) of this clause, does not apply to the following selling activities before an agency by independent sales representatives, provided such activities are prior to formal solicitation by an agency and are specifically limited to the merits of the matter:
  - Discussing with an agency (including individual demonstration) the qualities and characteristics of the person's products or services, conditions or terms of sale, and service capabilities; and
  - (ii) Technical discussions and other activities regarding the application or adaptation of the person's products or services for an agency's use.
- (d) Agreement. In accepting any contract, grant, cooperative agreement, or loan resulting from this solicitation, the person submitting the offer agrees not to make any payment prohibited by this clause.
- (e) Penalties. Any person who makes an expenditure prohibited under paragraph (b) of this clause shall be subject to civil penalties as provided for by 31 U.S.C. 1352. An imposition of a civil penalty does not prevent the Government from seeking any other remedy that may be applicable.
- (f) Cost Allowability. Nothing in this clause is to be interpreted to make allowable or reasonable any costs which would be unallowable or unreasonable in accordance with Part 31 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR), or OMB Circulars dealing with cost allowability for recipients of assistance agreements. Conversely, costs made specifically unallowable by the requirements in this clause will not be made allowable under any of the provisions of FAR Part 31 or the relevant OMB Circulars.



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#### 16. Equal Employment Opportunity

During the performance of this contract, the Contractor agrees as follows:

- (a) The Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.
- (b) The Contractor shall take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to (1) employment; (2) upgrading; (3) demotion; (4) transfer; (5) recruitment or recruitment advertising; (6) layoff or termination; (7) rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and (8) selection for training, including apprenticeship.
- (c) The Contractor shall post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment the notices to be provided by the Contracting Officer that explain this clause.
- (d) The Contractor shall, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.
- (e) The Contractor shall send, to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, the notice to be provided by the Contracting Officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of the Contractor's commitments under this clause, and post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- (f) The Contractor shall comply with Executive Order 11248, as amended, and the rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- (g) The Contractor shall furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246, as amended and by rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto. The Contractor shall permit access to its books, records, and accounts by the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.
- (h) In the event of a determination that the Contractor is not in compliance with this clause or any rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part, and the Contractor may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts, or federally assisted construction contracts under the procedures authorized in Executive Order 11248, as amended. In addition, sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked against the Contractor as provided in Executive Order 11248, as amended, the rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.
- (i) The Contractor shall include the terms and conditions of this clause in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by the rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued under Executive Order 11240, as amended, so that these terms and conditions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The Contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontractor or purchase order as the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development or the Secretary of Labor may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance; provided that if the

Contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction, the Contractor may request the United States to enter into the litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

#### 17. Dissemination or Disclosure of Information

No information or material shall be disseminated or disclosed to the general public, the news media, or any person or organization without prior express written approval by the HA.

#### 18. Contractor's Status

It is understood that the Contractor is an independent contractor and is not to be considered an employee of the HA, or assume any right, privilege or duties of an employee, and shall save harmless the HA and its employees from claims suits, actions and costs of every description resulting from the Contractor's activities on behalf of the HA in connection with this Agreement.

#### 19. Other Contractors

HA may undertake or award other contracts for additional work at or near the site(s) of the work under this contract. The contractor shall fully cooperate with the other contractors and with HA and HUD employees and shall carefully adapt scheduling and performing the work under this contract to accommodate the additional work, heeding any direction that may be provided by the Contracting Officer. The contractor shall not commit or permit any act that will interfere with the performance of work by any other contractor or HA employee.

#### 20. Liens

The Contractor is prohibited from placing a lien on HA's property. This prohibition shall apply to all subcontractors.

- Training and Employment Opportunities for Residents in the Project Area (Section 3, HUD Act of 1968; 24 CFR 135)



(g) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this provision, a late modification of an otherwise successful offer that makes its terms more favorable to the HA will be considered at any time it is received and may be accepted.

(h) If this solicitation is a request for proposals, proposals may be withdrawn by written notice, or if authorized by this solicitation, by telegram (including mailgram) or facsimile machine transmission received at any time before award. Proposals may be withdrawn in person by a offeror or its authorized representative if the identity of the person requesting withdrawal is established and the person signs a receipt for the offer before award. If this solicitation is an invitation for bids, bids may be withdrawn at any time prior to bid opening.

#### 7. Contract Award

(a) The HA will award a contract resulting from this solicitation to the responsible offeror whose offer conforming to the solicitation will be most advantageous to the HA, cost or price and other factors, specified elsewhere in this solicitation, considered.

#### (b) The HA may

- (1) reject any or all offers if such action is in the HA's interest,
- (2) accept other than the lowest offer,
- (3) waive informalities and minor irregularities in offers received, and (4) award more than one contract for all or part of the requirements stated.

(c) If this solicitation is a request for proposals, the HA may award a contract on the basis of initial offers received, without discussions. Therefore, each initial offer should contain the offeror's bestterms from a cost or price and technical standpoint.

(d) A written award or acceptance of offer mailed or otherwise furnished to the successful offeror within the time for acceptance specified in the offer shall result in a binding contract without further action by either party. If this solicitation is a request for proposals, before the offer's specified expiration time, the HA may accept an offer, whether or not there are negotiations after its receipt, unless a written notice of withdrawal is received before award. Negotiations conducted after receipt of an offer do not constitute a rejection or counteroffer by the HA.

(e) Neither financial data submitted with an offer, nor representations concerning facilities or financing, will form a part of the resulting contract.

#### 8. Service of Protest

Any protest against the award of a contract pursuant to this solicitation shall be served on the HA by obtaining written and dated acknowledgment of receipt from the HA at the address shown on the cover of this solicitation. The determination of the HA with regard to such protest or to proceed to award notwithstanding such protest shall be final unless appealed by the protestor.

#### 9. Offer Submission

Offers shall be submitted as follows and shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope and addressed to the office specified in the solicitation. The proposal shall show the hour and date specified in the solicitation for receipt, the solicitation number, and the name and address of the offeror, on the face of the envelope.

It is very important that the offer be properly identified on the face of the envelope as set forth above in order to insure that the date and time of receipt is stamped on the face of the offer envelope. Receiving procedures are: date and time stamp those envelopes identified as proposals and deliver them immediately to the appropriate contracting official, and only date stamp those envelopes which do not contain identification of the contents and deliver them to the appropriate procuring activity only through the routine mail delivery procedure.

## **Electronic Signature Procedures**

## I. Basis for these Procedures

To facilitate the use of electronic signatures to enhance electronic transactions consistent with applicable law; to be consistent with reasonable practices concerning electronic transactions and the continued expansion of those practices; and to effectuate its general purpose to make uniform the law with respect to the states enacting it [§322.006 Texas Business and Commerce Code].

Legal Authority:

## Federal Law

Notwithstanding any statute, regulation, or other rule of law, with respect to any transaction in or affecting interstate or foreign commerce –

- 1. a signature, contract, or other record relating to such transaction may not be denied legal effect, validity or enforceability solely because it is in electronic form, and
- 2. a contract relating to such transaction may not be denied legal effect, validity, or enforceability solely because an electronic signature or electronic record was used in its formation. [15 USCS § 7001 (a)]

## <u>Texas Law</u>

- (a) A record or signature may not be denied legal effect or enforceability solely because it is in electronic form.
- (b) A contract may not be denied legal effect or enforceability solely because an electronic record was used in its formation.
- (c) If a law requires a record to be in writing, an electronic record satisfies the law.
- (d) If a law requires a signature, an electronic signature satisfies the law. [§322.007 Tex. Bus. & Com Code]

### **Exemption to Preemption by Federal Electronic Signatures Act**

Because Texas adopted a Uniform Electronic Transactions Act (UETA), Texas Law modifies, limits, or supersedes the provisions of the Electronic Signatures in Global and National Commerce Act as authorized by Section 102 of that Act. An electronic signature will be legally recognized under federal and Texas state law if the signature methods conform to the methods in this policy. [§ 322.019]

### **Exceptions**

Electronic records and electronic signatures relating to a transaction do not apply to a transaction to the extent it is governed by:

- (1) wills, codicils, or testamentary trusts; or
- (2) the Uniform Commercial Code, other than Chapters 2 (Sales) and 2A(Leases).[§ 322.003].

## **Electronic Signatures Not Mandated**

These procedures do not mandate the use of electronic signature. A vendor that agrees to conduct a transaction by electronic means may refuse to conduct other transactions by electronic means. Prior to entering into any transaction by electronic means such as a contract, agreement, or purchase order, a vendor shall execute an AGREEMENT TO CONTRACT ELECTRONICALLY. [§ 322.005]

### Venue

Any and all issues pertaining to a transaction by electronic means will be governed and construed according to the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for any legal proceedings shall be in El Paso County Texas.



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## II. Definitions

- 1. "Agreement" means the bargain of the parties in fact, as found in their language or inferred from other circumstances and from rules, regulations, and procedures given the effect of agreements under laws otherwise applicable to a particular transaction.
- 2. "Automated transaction" means a transaction conducted or performed, in whole or in part, by electronic means or electronic records, in which the acts or records of one or both parties are not reviewed by an individual in the ordinary course in forming a contact, performing under and existing contact, or fulfilling an obligation required by the transaction.
- 3. "Computer program" means a set of statements or instructions to be used directly or indirectly in an information processing system in order to bring about a certain result.
- 4. "Contract" means the total legal obligation resulting from the parties' agreement as affected by this chapter and other applicable law.
- 5. "Electronic" means relating to technology having electrical, digital, magnetic, wireless, optical, electromagnetic, or similar capabilities.
- 6. "Electronic agent" means a computer program or an electronic or other automated means used independently to initiate an action or respond to electronic records or performances in whole or in part, without review or action by an individual.
- 7. "Electronic record" means a record created, generated, sent, communicated, received, or stored by electronic means.
- 8. "Electronic signature" means an electronic sound, symbol, or process attached to or logically associated with a record and executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the record.
- 9. "Governmental agency" means an executive, legislative, or judicial agency, department, board, commission, authority, institution, or instrumentality of the federal government or of a state or of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of a state.
- 10. "Information" means data, text, images, sounds, codes, computer programs, software, databases or the like.
- 11. "Information processing system" means an electronic system for creating, generating, sending, receiving, storing, displaying, or processing information.
- 12. "Record" means information that is inscribed on a tangible medium and is retrievable in perceivable form.
- 13. "Security procedure" means a procedure employed for the purpose of verifying that an electronic signature, record, or performance is that of a specific person or for detecting changes or errors in the information in an electronic record. The term includes a procedure that requires the use of algorithms or other codes, identifying words or numbers, encryption, or callback or other acknowledgment procedures.
- 14. "State" means a state of the United States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin Islands, or any territory or insular possession subject to the jurisdiction of the United States. The term includes an Indian tribe or band, or Alaskan native village, which is recognized by federal law or formally acknowledged by a state.
- 15. "Transaction" means an action or set of actions occurring between two or more persons relating to the conduct of business, commercial, or governmental affairs. [§ 322.002]
- 16. "Notarization and Acknowledgment" means if a law requires a signature or record to be notarized, acknowledged, verified, or made under oath, the requirement is satisfied if the electronic signature of the person authorized to perform those acts, together with all other information required to be included by other applicable law, is attached to or logically associated with the signature or record. [322.011]
- 17. "Use of Electronic Records and Electronic Signatures' means this policy applies only to transactions between parties each of which has agreed to conduct transactions by electronic means. Whether the parties agree to conduct a transaction by electronic means is determined from the context and surrounding circumstances, including the parties' conduct. A party that agrees to conduct a transaction by electronic



means may refuse to conduct other transactions by electronic means. The right granted by this subsection may not be waived by agreement.

## III. Practical Considerations

## Time and Place of Sending:

- (a) Unless otherwise agreed between the sender and the recipient, an electronic record is *sent* when it:
  - 1. is addressed properly or otherwise directed properly to an information processing system that the recipient has designated or uses for the purpose of receiving electronic records or information of the type sent and from which the recipient is able to retrieve the electronic record;
  - 2. is in a form capable of being processed by that system; and
  - 3. enters an information processing system outside the control of the sender or of a person that sent the electronic record on behalf of the sender or enters a region of the information processing system designated or used by the recipient which is under the control of the recipient.

## Time and Place of Receiving

- (b) Unless otherwise agreed between the sender and the recipient, an electronic record is *received* when:
  - 1. it enters an information processing system that the recipient has designated or uses for the purpose of receiving electronic records or information of the type sent and from which the recipient is able to retrieve the electronic record; and
  - 2. it is in a form capable of being processed by that system.
- (c) Subsection (b) applies even if the place the information processing system is located is different from the place the electronic record is deemed to be received under subsection (d).
- (d) Unless otherwise expressly provided in the electronic record or agreed between the sender and the recipient, an electronic record is deemed to be sent from the sender's place of business and to be received at the recipient's place of business. For purposes of this subsection, the following rules apply:
  - 1. if the sender or the recipient has more than one place of business, the place of business of that person is the place having the closest relationship to the underlying transaction; and
  - 2. if the sender or the recipient does not have a place of business, the place of business is the sender's or the recipient's residence, as the case may be.
- (e) An electronic record is received under Subsection (b) even if no individual is aware of its receipt.
- (f) Receipt of an electronic acknowledgement from an information processing system described in Subsection
   (b) establishes that a record was received but, by itself, does not establish that the content sent corresponds to the content received.
- (g) If a person is aware that an electronic record purportedly send under Subsection (a), or purportedly received under Subsection (b), was not actually sent or received, the legal effect of the sending or receipt is determined by other applicable law. Except to the extent permitted by the other law, the requirements of this subsection may not be varied by agreement. [§ 322.015]

### **Provision of Information in Writing:**

If parties have agreed to conduct a transaction by electronic means and a law requires a person to provide, send, or deliver information in writing to another person, the requirement is satisfied if the information is provided, sent, or delivered, as the case may be, in an electronic record capable of retention by the recipient at the time of receipt. An electronic record is not capable of retention by the recipient if the sender or its information processing system inhibits the ability of the recipient to print or store the electronic record. [§322.008]

## Security:

Effect of Change or Error

(a) If a change or error in an electronic record occurs in a transmission between parties to a transaction, the rule provided by this section apply.



(b) If the parties have agreed to use a security procedure to detect changes or errors and one party has conformed to the procedure, but the other party has not, and the nonconforming party would have detected the change or error had the party also conformed, the conforming party may avoid the effect of the changed or erroneous electronic record. [§322.010]

## **Record Retention:**

## Retention of Electronic Records; Originals

HACEP records are governed by the Local Government Records Act of Chapters 201, 204, and 205 of the Texas Local Government Code, as well as the Texas State Library and Archives Commission under Section 441.158 of the Texas Government Code with regard to the retention schedules. As such, it is imperative that all records generated pursuant to these electronic signature policies and procedures be maintained and retained in accordance with the Texas State Library and Archives Commission-Retention Schedule for Records Common to All Local Governments.

- (a) The record retention requirement is satisfied by retaining an electronic record of the information in the record which:
  - 1. accurately reflects the information set forth in the record after it was first generated in its final form as an electronic record or otherwise; and
  - 2. remains accessible for later reference.
- (b) A requirement to retain a record in accordance with Subsection (a) does not apply to any information the sole purpose of which is to enable the record to be sent, communicated, or received.
- (c) A person may satisfy Subsection (a) by using the services of another person if the requirements of that section are satisfied.
- (d) If a law requires a record to be presented or retained in its original form or provides consequences if the record is not presented or retained in its original form, the law is satisfied by an electronic record retained in accordance with Subsection (a).
- (e) If a law requires retention of a check, that requirement is satisfied by retention of an electronic record of the information on the front and back of the check in accordance with Subsection (a).
- (f) A record retained as an electronic record in accordance with Subsection (a) satisfies a law requiring a person to retain a record for evidentiary, audit, or like purposes, unless a law enacted after January 1, 2002, specifically prohibits the use of an electronic record for the specified purpose.
- (g) This section does not preclude HACEP from specifying additional requirements for the retention of a record subject to the agency's jurisdiction.

## IV. Basic Procedures

- (a) When a contract or contract modification has been created, the Procurement staff member shall convert said document into a PDF file.
- (b) The Procurement staff members shall upload the PDF document into the DocuSign website. The URL is <u>https://www.docusign.com/</u>.
- (c) The Procurement staff member shall identify all signing places on the document in the DocuSign website.
- (d) The Procurement staff member shall enter the email address of all parties that are required to sign the documents.
- (e) Each successive signature will cause DocuSign.com to email the next signer. Once the final signature is performed (by the HACEP Chief Executive Officer, designated as the Contracting Officer), all signers will receive a copy of the signed document.

## V. Security

- (a) HACEP's email servers are SSL certified, which provides a high level of security. DocuSign's encryption features and private SSL 256 bit viewing session is standard, which is compatible to HACEP's new security standards. According to the DocuSign website, their service also features disaster recovery and third-party penetration testing.
- (b) Personal Identification Number (PIN) or password: The CEO accessing the DocuSign website is requested to enter a "shared" personal identification number (called "shared" because it is known both to the user and to the creator of the document). When the CEO clicks on the URL derived from a secure email, he also enters a PIN. The system checks that PIN against data in a database



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to ensure its correctness and thereby "authenticates" the user. If the authentication process is performed over an open network such as the Internet, it is usually essential that at least the shared secret be encrypted. This task can be accomplished by using technology called Secure Sockets Layer (SSL), which uses a combination of public key technology and symmetric cryptography to automatically encrypt information as it is sent over the Internet by the user and decrypt it before it is read by the intended recipient. SSL currently is built into the HACEP email system. In such a fashion that its use is transparent to the end user. Assuming the password is protected during transmission, as described above, impersonating the user requires obtaining the user's password. This may be relatively easy if users do not follow appropriate guidelines for password creation and use. HACEP shall establish adequate guidelines for password creation and protection.

C) The PIN shall be provided to the Procurement Department for future use. The method for providing the PIN shall be in person so as to effect different communication routes.

## TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT GUIDELINES



## Effective July 1, 2014, the Housing Authority of the City of El Paso (HACEP) implemented the following guidelines applicable to all contractor business travel.

HACEP will reimburse based on the GSA Per Diem Rates <u>www.gsa.gov/perdiem</u> for the City of El Paso, TX:

Lodging

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Meals and Incidentals Expenses

The following categories define HACEP expectations for Contractor travel and meal expenses. Proper documentation must be submitted with the Contractor invoice before HACEP will consider reimbursement of travel or meal expenses. Such documentation must include detailed receipts for all requested amounts and the valid business reason for the expense. In addition, where HACEP management approval is required prior to reimbursement, Contractor must submit a memo detailing management's approval or the signature of the appropriate HACEP management representative on the detailed receipt. HACEP reserves the right to request additional information when assessing payment and may refuse or limit payment based on the documentation, or lack thereof, provided.

- Airfare Airfare is reimbursed at commercial Coach Class using lowest logical airfare and advance purchase options. Airfare should be booked as soon as practical to obtain best pricing options. HACEP allows non-stop service to be considered as lowest logical airfare. HACEP will not reimburse unused tickets, airport ticket class changes, or seat location upgrades. Use of non-commercial air service is expressly prohibited.
- **Tolls and Parking** Parking will be reimbursed at actual cost for business trip expense. Commuter tolls and parking within city metropolitan area where work is performed is not reimbursable.
- **Transportation Services** While scheduled transportation service using airport shuttles is permitted with proper receipts, private limousine or luxury shuttle service is **not reimbursable**. Taxi service is allowed in lieu of auto rental, however receipts must be provided.
- **Personal Vehicle** Use of a personal vehicle in lieu of public transportation or a rental car is permitted when pre-approved by HACEP management. Mileage must be tracked on a daily trip log and reimbursement will be calculated at IRS standard mileage rates. Reported mileage must exclude normal commute mileage in accordance with IRS commute definitions. No personal vehicle expense, including gasoline or car repairs, is allowed for reimbursement.
- Entertainment Casual entertainment including alcoholic beverages is *not reimbursable*. HACEP management must pre-authorize any scheduled group events and such events must be limited to specific milestone or project recognition events. HACEP will not reimburse Contractor for entertaining HACEP employees without prior HACEP management approval.
