## Scope of Work

The following work is to be performed at specified Housing Authority properties in Lubbock, Texas.

- The vendor will provide all labor and equipment to grind or shave concrete sidewalk offsets up to 2" identified by the Project Manager.
- Provide all labor and equipment to prep and fill specified driveway cracks/gaps/holes.


## Specifications

## Time Requirements

Contract Date: The contract must be signed within five business days after the Quote Due Date.

Start Date: Contractor must start work within Ten business days after the contract is signed unless approved in writing by the Housing Authority.

Completion: The project must be complete within Ten calendar days after the Start Date unless approved in writing by the Housing Authority.

## General Specifications

Contractor is responsible for confirming measurements and quantities prior to submitting bid.
Contractor responsible for providing all labor and materials..
Contractor will obtain permits and incur costs of permits and fees required to complete this project.

The Contractor shall maintain insurance required by this solicitation. The Contractor must notify the Housing Authority immediately upon any lapse in coverage.

The Contractor shall comply with all laws and requirements regarding licensing, inspections and fees.

All salvage debris \& material will become the property of, and be promptly disposed of by, the contractor in a legal manner.

All aspects of this project will be conducted in accordance with HUD 5370 EZ, General Conditions of the Construction Contract and other applicable forms provided in bid packages.

The Contractor shall complete all activities included in the attached specifications and writeup

For all construction related/modernization contracts exceeding $\$ 2,000.00$, compliance with all applicable Davis-Bacon wages and reporting activities is required. This compliance includes, but is not limited to:

- Weekly Payroll reporting
- Onsite document postings
- Paying employees wage rates equal to, or exceeding, the rates noted on the current applicable Wage Determination for each classification listed.

Set controls to guard access to the work area during demolition and installation of the new materials to maintain safety of the residents during performance of the work.

The contractor shall take steps to avoid any damage to the buildings or property belonging to tenants or the Housing Authority. The contractor is responsible for repair or replacement of property and/or buildings damaged by actions or negligence of the contractor, contractor's employees/representatives or contractor's sub-contractors.

The contractor is responsible for all measurements and calculations prior to bidding. Change Orders shall not be issued due to the failure of the Contractor to conduct onsite inspections or confirm measurements.

## Concrete Grinding

- Addresses and measurement estimates appear at the end of the Specifications section.
- The vendor will provide all labor and equipment to grind or shave concrete sidewalk offsets up to 2" identified by the Project Manager.
- Any remaining sidewalk after grinding must be 2 " inches or more in depth.
- All concrete locations shall be ground or shaved as to provide a smooth transition between concrete slabs.
- The ground or shaved areas shall be uniform, smooth, minimal grooving and straight at the backline with little or no scarring of the adjacent concrete.
- ADA requirements of 8:1 slope will be provided in addition to a non-slip finish.
- All grinding or shaving residue shall be collected, removed and disposed of by Contractor at no additional charge.


## Resurfacing and Filling Cracks/Gaps

- Addresses and measurement estimates appear at the end of the Specifications section.
- Communicate with development management/maintenance staff to ensure residents have advance notice of repairs so vehicles can be moved and not interfere with the project activities.
- Provide all labor and equipment to prep and resurface specified driveway and sidewalk areas.
- Provide all labor and equipment to prep and fill specified driveway cracks/gaps.
- The fill material for cracks exceeding $1 / 2$ " in width must be a polymer concrete product designed for concrete resurfacing/repair. Silicone or rubber caulk products are not acceptable.
- An elastomeric caulk may be used as fill material for cracks up to $1 / 2$ " in width. Silicone or rubber caulk products are not acceptable.
- All resurfaced/repaired areas must be smooth, level and free of tripping hazards.
- Protect existing control joints to prevent filling with resurfacing product.
- Clean/prepare surfaces and apply product according to manufacturer's specifications to achieve maximum adherence.
